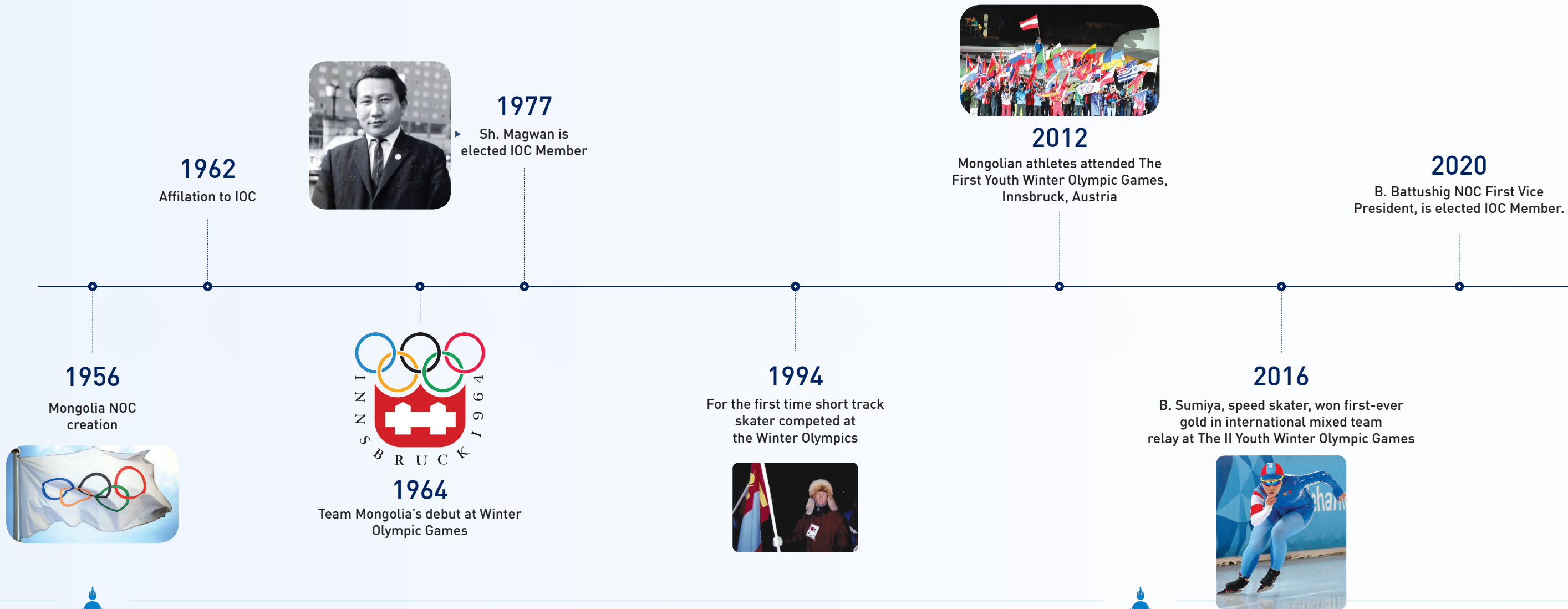

Mongolia covers an area of **1.564.116** square kilometers. It is the 18 th largest country in the world.

3.3 million

As of 2021 the population of Mongolia has reached to 3.3 million. Mongolia ranks in the 135 th place in the world in terms of population.



53% of the population is Buddhist.

98.4% of the adult population is literate.

95% of the population is Khalkh,
4% is Kazakh and
1% is others.
